



# Broxbourne CE Primary School

## EYFS

### Uniform

All our children wear school uniform. Children entering the Early Years Foundation Stage should wear the following:

#### EY1

- navy sweatshirt with school logo
- a white polo shirt (school logo optional)
- dark grey pinafore with white, plain knee high socks (not over the knee) or grey tights for girls.
- dark grey shorts and grey socks for boys. No trainer socks.
- dark grey trousers are permitted after October half term until Easter.
- school summer dress during the Summer Term and first half of the Autumn Term for girls (provided by the school outfitters), with white, plain knee high socks or white, plain ankle socks. No trainer socks.

OR

- navy sweatshirt with school logo
- clothes of your choice (not jeans)

#### EY2

- kingfisher blue cardigan or sweatshirt with school logo
- white polo shirt (school logo optional)
- dark grey pinafore with white, plain knee high socks (not over the knee) or grey tights for girls.
- dark grey shorts for boys during the Summer Term and first half of the Autumn Term with plain grey socks. No trainer socks.
- dark grey trousers for boys for second half of the Autumn Term (after October half term) and the Spring Term **only**, with plain grey socks. No trainer socks.
- school summer dress for girls during the Summer Term and first half of the Autumn Term (provided by the school outfitters) with white, plain knee high socks or white, plain ankle socks. No trainer socks.

#### EY1 & EY2

- Sensible flat shoes (NOT boots) - black or navy - that they can put on themselves eg with Velcro fastening or slip on (if lace up, zip or buckle shoes are worn, the children must be able to do these up independently). Black, navy or white closed-toe sandals are permitted in the Summer Term.



## PE KIT FOR EY1 & EY2

School PE T-shirt or plain white T-shirt,  
Navy PE shorts,

White socks and Black plimsolls

A drawstring PE bag with logo to contain PE kit



## OTHER ESSENTIAL ITEMS

Navy bookbag, not rucksack, with school logo

Wellington boots (to be kept at school)

Waterproof (Cagoule style) jacket (to be kept at school)

Sun hat (Summer Term & when weather warm)



### For reasons of safety:-

- We ask all children to tie their hair back when using school equipment. This is particularly important during games and PE. Hair should be kept neat in conventional styles to the satisfaction of staff and Governors. Hair should be cut no shorter than Number 2 - with no patterns or significant difference in grade lengths. Gel and braids/beads must not be worn. Hair bands and slides etc. should be kept simple and be in school colours. Hard hair bands should not be worn for P.E.
- Jewellery must not be worn.
- Earrings are not permitted, except for children with pierced ears, who may wear only simple studs and ensure that they take them out for all physical education activities. (Staff cannot accept responsibility for removing or replacing earrings or for their loss). In the initial 6 week period when earrings cannot be removed, children must provide tape / elastoplast to cover their studs, for safety during PE.
- Children are expected not to wear make-up including nail varnish, tattoos, etc.

The sweatshirts, cardigans, book bags, drawstring bags, PE tops, summer dresses and fleeces can be purchased directly from our school outfitters (contact details to the left). Other items may be purchased from the outfitter of your choice. Please ensure that all personal property is clearly labelled with your child's name. Although care is taken to ensure the children's clothes are not spoilt, please encourage your child to dress in clothes which are suitable for activity based learning experiences. It is useful to have a change of clothing which is kept at school. If parents/carers have difficulty providing our school uniform, please let us know, we will try to help. Any enquiries will be dealt with in the strictest confidence by Mr Miller or Mrs Melidoro.

\*Wellington boots may be worn in bad weather for travelling to and from school, school shoes to be worn whilst in school.

\*\*Children should only wear laced plimsolls when they are able to fasten and unfasten their own laces (unless there is a particular medical reason for the child wearing certain footwear).

### ESSENTIAL SWIMMING KIT

You will be notified when your child is due to participate in swimming lessons.

Simple swimming costume or trunks (shorts are not acceptable)

Swimming hat (girls and boys)

A waterproof coat with a hood

Goggles (optional)

### OPTIONAL ITEMS

Navy zipped fleece with school logo (light jacket, not waterproof - not to replace turquoise sweatshirt). Reversible waterproof jacket.

#### For reasons of safety:-

- We ask all children to tie their hair back when using school equipment. This is particularly important during games and PE. Hair should be kept neat in conventional styles to the satisfaction of staff and Governors. Hair should be cut no shorter than Number 2 - with no patterns or significant difference in grade lengths. Hair products and braids/beads must not be worn. Hair bands and slides etc. should be kept simple and be in school colours. Hard hair bands should not be worn for P.E.
- Children may wear named watches when they are able to use them appropriately. Jewellery must not be worn.
- Earrings are not permitted, except for children with pierced ears, who may wear only simple studs and ensure that they take them out for all physical education activities.

If parents/carers have difficulty providing our school uniform, please let us know, we will try to help. Any enquiries will be dealt with in the strictest confidence by Mr Miller or Mrs Melidoro.
