## Key Stage 1

### Uniform



All our children wear school uniform. We work with you to ensure all our children maintain a smart appearance. The children are positively encouraged and rewarded for taking care of their possessions and for remembering to bring the right items to school on the right day. The uniform list is divided into two sections, the essential items and the optional items. Please ensure that all personal property is clearly labelled with your child's name. The uniform items particular to our school, eg the sweatshirt, may be purchased from our School Uniform Supplier, Smiths Schoolwear. Contact details on page 7. Other items may be purchased from the outfitter of your choice.

### ESSENTIAL ITEMS - AUTUMN AND SPRING UNIFORM

This is worn throughout the Autumn and Spring terms. However children may wear Summer uniform from September to October half term if they wish.

#### GIRLS



#### Key Stage 1


A plain, white shirt and school tie  
 School sweatshirt or cardigan  
 Knee high white socks  
 (not trainer or over the knee socks)  
 or navy  
 or grey tights  
 Sensible flat shoes - black or navy\*



#### BOYS



#### Key Stage 1

A plain, white shirt and school tie  
 School sweatshirt  
 Grey socks (not trainer socks)  
 Sensible flat shoes - black  
 Black plimsolls\*\* 

During cold weather, children may wear jogging bottoms to travel to school and at playtime.

\*Wellington boots may be worn in bad weather for travelling to and from school, school shoes to be worn whilst in school.

\*\*Children should only wear laced plimsolls when they are able to fasten and unfasten their own laces (unless there is a particular medical reason for the child wearing certain footwear).



## ESSENTIAL ITEMS - SUMMER UNIFORM

This is worn throughout the Summer term and, depending on the weather, during the first half of the Autumn term.

### GIRLS

#### Key Stage 1

A school dress

White socks

(not trainer or over the knee socks)

### BOYS

#### Key Stage 1

White polo shirt or short sleeved, open necked white shirt

Grey shorts

Grey socks (not trainer socks)

As an alternative, children may wear black, navy or white closed-toe sandals with their Summer uniform.

## ESSENTIAL ITEMS - PE / ART KIT



School PE T-shirt

Navy PE shorts

White socks

A drawstring PE bag to contain PE kit

Painting overall (an old shirt with elasticated cuffs, with collar removed is ideal).



## ESSENTIAL SWIMMING KIT

You will be notified when your child is due to participate in swimming lessons.

Simple swimming costume or trunks (shorts are not acceptable)

Swimming hat (girls and boys)

A waterproof coat with a hood

Goggles (optional)



## OPTIONAL ITEMS

Navy zipped fleece with school logo (light jacket, not waterproof - not to replace turquoise sweatshirt). Reversible waterproof jacket.



### For reasons of safety:-

- We ask all children to tie their hair back when using school equipment. This is particularly important during games and PE. Hair should be kept neat in conventional styles to the satisfaction of staff and Governors. Hair should be cut no shorter than Number 3. Gel and braids/beads must not be worn. Hair bands and slides etc. should be kept simple and be in school colours. Hard hair bands should not be worn for P.E.
- Children may wear named watches when they are able to use them appropriately. Jewellery must not be worn.
- Earrings are not permitted, except for children with pierced ears, who may wear only simple studs and ensure that they take them out for all physical education activities. (Staff cannot accept responsibility for removing or replacing earrings or for their loss). In the initial 6 week period when earrings cannot be removed, children must provide tape / elastoplast to cover their studs, for safety during PE and games.
- Children are expected not to wear make-up including nail varnish, tattoos, etc.

If parents / carers have difficulty providing our school uniform, please let us know, we will try to help.

By working together we can encourage all our children to develop the vital independent learning skills of:-

- a. taking appropriate care of their appearance;
- b. looking after their own possessions;
- c. ensuring they have the correct equipment for each school activity, at the right time on the right day!
