Sports Premium Funding 2015-16

The government has provided additional funding for the academic year 2015 to 2016 to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding is provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport and is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools.

At Broxbourne CE Primary School our priority is to provide high quality and exciting sporting opportunities for our children. We aim to improve the quality of our PE provision and increase the participation rates of our children through:

- Engaging with PE specialist teachers within the local Sports Partnership to develop CPD opportunities for school staff in order to improve the quality of PE provision
- Providing a wide range of extra-curricular sporting clubs and activities
- Organising and participating in Level 1 (Intra-school) and Level 2 (Inter-school) competitions for our children
- Providing places for vulnerable pupils on after school sports clubs
- Celebrating the success of school sport teams and individual high level performances
- Fostering strong links with local sports clubs
- Providing high quality and wide ranging resources
- To develop a Sports Leader program within our school

At Broxbourne CE Primary School we ensure first rate provision in Physical Education and value the contribution sport can make towards physical well-being and a healthy lifestyle for all our children. Broxbourne offers a wide range of sporting opportunities, from an extensive range of extra-curricular clubs, to participation in a number of Inter School and Inter House sporting competitions. We strongly believe in building on the legacy of the London 2012 Olympics and 'Staying Inspired!'

The Sports Grant for Broxbourne CE Primary School for the financial year 2015/16 is £8,900.00

This is to be spent in the following manner:

Breakdown of PE and Sports funding budget

PE Specialist teacher 1 day per week £7800 to upskill our teachers and take a lead in PE throughout our school

A10 Sports Partnership Core Offer and pupil participation in A10 events £250

Pay as you go consultancy £500

Resources (indoor athletics/gymnastics equipment) £1200

PE Cupboard storage project £1500

Additional staff training and attendance at sports events £600

Total £11,850

Impact of the Sports Premium 2015-16 at Broxbourne.

As a result of the above actions and their implementation:

PE equipment has been resourced for infant agility, gymnastics and indoor athletics. A PE store has been created to ensure equipment is organised and easily accessible. Participation rates in extra-curricular sport have increased from 60 pupils participating weekly to 130 pupils for the autumn and summer term. The number of extra-curricular sports clubs and activities have been enhanced and for the autumn and spring terms, provision was as follows:

Monday after school – Y1/2 multi-skills (20), Y3/4 netball (20), Y5/6 netball (20), Y3/4 football (20), Y5/6 football (20)

Tuesday after school – Y2-4 gymnastics (15)

Wednesday after school – Y1-4 tennis (15)

Broxbourne has taken part in inter-school competitive sporting competitions in Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 this year for tag rugby, indoor athletics, Kwik cricket, tennis, football and netball. Broxbourne became District Champions for Y6 football and advanced to the Hertfordshire Youth Games County final for tag rugby in 2016. We believe our children should have the opportunity to represent the school in a competitive environment and that the learning from this situation is important.

Our Key Stage 2 invasion games now culminate each half term in an intra-school house sporting competition, whereby the pupils have the opportunity to use the skills they have developed over the unit.

The staff have received Inset training in the delivery of outdoor adventurous activities and gymnastics to enhance their teaching of these areas.
