

SCHOOL UNIFORM

All our children wear school uniform. We work with you to ensure our children maintain a smart appearance. The children are positively encouraged and rewarded for taking care of their possessions and for remembering to bring the right items to school on the right day. The uniform list is divided into two lists, the essential items and the optional items. Please ensure that all personal property is clearly labelled with your child's name. The uniform items particular to our school, e.g. the Sweatshirt, may be purchased from our School Uniform Supplier, Smiths Schoolwear. Contact details on page 14. Other items may be purchased from the outfitter of your choice.

Children entering the Early Years Foundation Stage should wear the following:

EY1

- ◆ Navy sweatshirt with school logo
 - ◆ A white polo shirt (school logo optional)
- PLUS
- ◆ Dark grey, plain shorts with grey socks, (no trainer socks)
- OR
- ◆ Dark grey, plain trousers with grey socks
- OR
- ◆ Dark grey plain pinafore with plain white knee high socks (not over the knee) or grey tights
 - ◆ School summer dress during the Summer Term and the first half of the Autumn Term (provided by school outfitters) with plain white knee high socks or plain white ankle socks, (no trainer socks)
 - ◆ Sensible black, flat shoes (NOT boots) - that they can put on themselves e.g. with Velcro fastening or slip on (if lace up, zip or buckle shoes are worn, the children must be able to do these up independently). Black closed-toe sandals are permitted in the Summer Term.



OR

- ◆ Navy Sweatshirt with school logo
- ◆ Clothes of your choice (not jeans)

EY2 ESSENTIAL ITEMS

- ◆ Kingfisher blue cardigan or sweatshirt with school logo
 - ◆ A white polo shirt (school logo optional)
- PLUS
- ◆ Dark grey, plain shorts with plain grey socks, (no trainer socks)
- OR
- ◆ Dark grey, plain trousers with plain grey socks, (no trainer socks)
- OR
- ◆ Dark grey, plain pinafore with plain white knee high socks (not over the knee) or grey tights
- OR
- ◆ Dark grey, plain skirt with plain white knee high socks (not over the knee) or grey tights
 - ◆ School summer dress during the Summer Term and the first half of the Autumn Term (provided by school outfitters) with plain white knee high socks or plain white ankle socks, (no trainer socks)
 - ◆ See page 13 for PE Kit requirements

EY1 & EY2

- ◆ Sensible black, flat shoes (NOT boots) - that they can put on themselves e.g. with Velcro fastening or slip on (if lace up, zip or buckle shoes are worn, the children must be able to do these up independently). Black closed-toe sandals are permitted in the Summer Term.
- ◆ Navy bookbag, NOT rucksack, with school logo
- ◆ Wellington boots (to be kept at school)
- ◆ Waterproof (cagoule style - to be kept in school)
- ◆ Sun hat—Summer Term & when weather is warm

ESSENTIAL ITEMS - AUTUMN & SPRING UNIFORM

KEY STAGE 1 AND KEY STAGE 2

AUTUMN (After October Half Term) & SPRING UNIFORM

- ◆ A white shirt & school tie
- ◆ Kingfisher blue cardigan or sweatshirt with school logo
- PLUS
- ◆ Dark grey, plain shorts with plain grey socks, (no trainer socks)
- OR
- ◆ Dark grey, plain trousers with plain grey socks, (no trainer socks)
- OR
- ◆ Dark grey, plain pinafore with plain white knee high socks (not over the knee) or grey tights
- OR
- ◆ Dark grey, plain skirt with plain white knee high socks (not over the knee) or grey tights
- ◆ Sensible flat black shoes (not boots or trainers)

ESSENTIAL ITEMS - SUMMER UNIFORM

KEY STAGE 1 AND KEY STAGE 2

SUMMER TERM & AUTUMN TERM (Before October Half Term, depending on the weather)

- ◆ A white polo shirt (logo optional)
- ◆ Kingfisher blue cardigan or sweatshirt with school logo
- PLUS
- ◆ Dark grey, plain shorts with plain grey socks, (no trainer socks)
- OR

SCHOOL UNIFORM CONTINUED

KEY STAGE 1 AND KEY STAGE 2

SUMMER TERM & AUTUMN TERM (Before October Half Term, depending on the weather)

- ◆ Dark grey, plain trousers with plain grey socks, (no trainer socks)
OR
- ◆ Dark grey, plain pinafore with plain white knee high socks (not over the knee) or grey tights
OR
- ◆ Dark grey, plain skirt with plain white knee high socks (not over the knee) or grey tights
ALTERNATIVELY
- ◆ School summer dress (provided by school outfitters) with plain white knee high socks or plain white ankle socks, (no trainer socks)
- ◆ Sensible flat black shoes or closed-toe sandals (not boots or trainers)

***The FA recommends that for safety, the children have football boots with metal or nylon studs. Plastic studs are not acceptable as they can splinter and cause injury. We advise against wearing boots with blades and can take no responsibility if children wear them. Astro turf shoes are not a replacement for football boots or trainers. The school can take no responsibility if children wear astro turf shoes. This is relevant to all sports activities, including clubs.

ESSENTIAL ITEMS - SWIMMING KIT

SCHOOL UNIFORM

For reasons of safety:-

- ◆ We ask all children to tie their hair back when using school equipment. This is particularly important during games and PE. Hair should be kept neat in conventional styles to the satisfaction of staff and governors. Hair should be cut no shorter than a number 2. Hair products and wrapped braids/beads must not be worn. Hair bands and slides etc should be kept simple and be in school colours. Hair must not be dyed or have temporary colour. Hard hairbands should not be worn for PE.
- ◆ Children may wear named watches when they are able to use them appropriately. Fitness Tracker watches may be worn providing the text message and call functions are disabled.
- ◆ Jewellery must not be worn
- ◆ Earrings are not permitted except for children with pierced ears, who may wear only simple studs and ensure they are removed for all physical education activities. (Staff cannot accept responsibility for removing and replacing earrings or for their loss.). In the initial 6 week period when earrings cannot be removed, children must provide tape/elastoplast to cover studs, for safety, during PE and games.
- ◆ Children should not wear make-up, nail varnish, tattoos, fake tan etc.
